



Spanish FA sign collaboration agreement with the Japanese FA

The aim of this agreement between the two organizations is to enhance the quality of football in Japan and Spain through various activities

The Spanish Football Association (RFEF) has signed an agreement with the Japan Football Association (JFA) aimed at increasing the levels of footballing co-operation between the two organizations. Both sides have reached the agreement with the aim of exchanging their varied experiences in order to contribute to the development of the sport in both Japan and Spain.

Spanish FA president Luis Rubiales said: “It’s a really happy day for us. This contributes to the expansion of Spanish football around the world.”

Social integration projects will be supported through football training sessions for vulnerable populations.

JFA President Tashima Kohzo said: “Today is a very special day for us”

There will be knowledge and experience sharing in the fields of strategic planning and competition organization as well as studies, training and advice so that both Federations’ sporting development can flourish. A recruitment drive for coaches, fitness coaches and referees will be launched, while both sides will have access to strategic resources, training sessions and development programmes.
